1. The Introduction Paragraph

There are two basic options for writing this paragraph: (1) direct and (2) anecdote (see examples below). Your readers are busy. They have to read dozens of these essays, and you $GRQ \P W ZDQW WR ER$ misdirect them. Instead, keep things short, simple, and to-the-point. So, I almost always recommend option 1.
