RNBSNNursingOrientation

All studentsaccepted into the RNBSN program mustattend a mandatory orientation session. Students must submit a criminal background check and urine drug screen as part of the initial process; the School of Nursing reserves the right to deny admission students based on prior minimal activities found on the background check. Students must also agree to have multiple immunization completed prior to starting the program, be in good physical and behavioral health, complete and maintain American Heart Association Basic Life Support Certification for Health care Providers, and have individual health insurance throughout the program. Additional information will be addressed during this orientation.
