# Barricading Procedures

1. Establish a perimeter around the area to be barricaded. Use caution tape or other visible markers to define the boundaries.

2. Assign personnel to monitor the perimeter and prevent unauthorized access. Use communication devices to maintain contact.



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## BeachALERT!

### Emergency Notification System (ENS)

BeachALERT is a system that allows you to receive emergency notifications via text message, email, or phone call. It is designed to provide you with the most timely and accurate information during an emergency.

BeachALERT is a free service provided by the University of California, San Diego. It is available to all members of the UCSD community, including students, faculty, and staff.

1) To sign up for BeachALERT, visit the website [www.ucsd.edu/beachalert](http://www.ucsd.edu/beachalert) and click on the "Sign Up" button. 2) You will be prompted to enter your contact information, including your name, email address, and phone number.

3) You will be asked to select the types of emergency notifications you wish to receive. 4) You will be asked to verify your contact information. 5) Once you have completed the sign-up process, you will receive a confirmation email and a text message from BeachALERT.

6) You can manage your BeachALERT preferences at any time by visiting the website [www.ucsd.edu/beachalert](http://www.ucsd.edu/beachalert) and clicking on the "Manage My Account" button. 7) BeachALERT is a secure system and your information is protected. 8) BeachALERT is available 24/7. 9) BeachALERT is a free service.

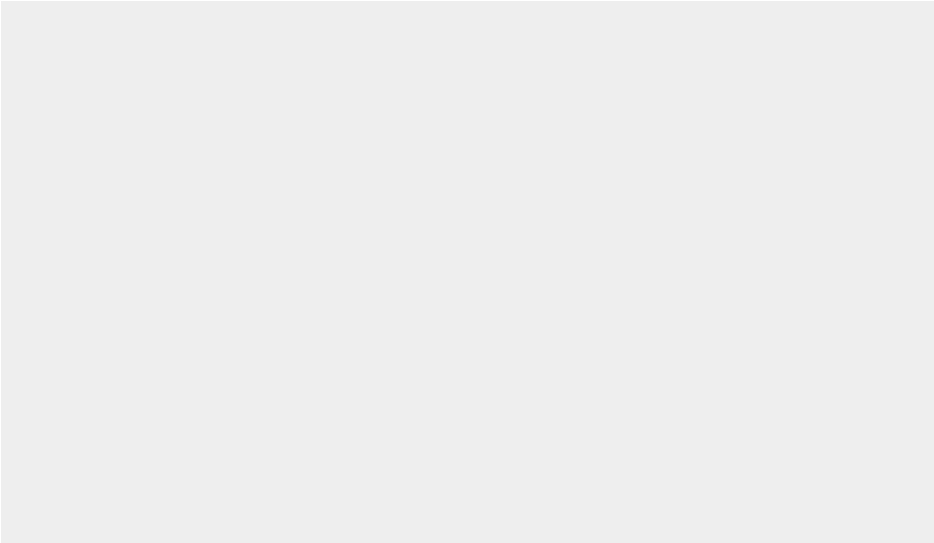
