This addendum is entered into between the Trustees of the California State University, CSU Long Beach, hereinafter called "CSULB" or "University" and the individual whose name appears above, hereinafter called "Licensee."

In consideration for Licensee to maintain an Assistance Animal within Housing & Residential Life (HRL) buildings, Licensee and University hereby agree to adhere to the terms and conditions set forth in the Housing & Residential Life License Agreement (License Agreement) and the equipment set forth below. This addendum is valid during the license period indicated above during the time frame outlined in Section II of the License Agreement. Permission for reinstatement of this agreement in future occupancy terms must be requested at the time the new license agreement is signed and will require an application request from the Bob Mury Access Center (BMAC). All terms of the License Agreement not explicitly altered by this addendum remain in force.

The University recognizes the importance of Assistance Animals under the Fair Housing Act that provide emotional support to individuals with disabilities. CSULB is committed to allowing Assistance Animals to provide individuals with disabilities equal opportunity to use and enjoy the residence halls.
