Program Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission to the Psychology Cohort BA, applicants must demonstrate the following:

- x Minimum Cumulative GPA: 2.5
- x Minimum lower division preparation (grade C or better required)
 - o The following suite of major preparation courses must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.5:
 - f PSY 100 General Psychology
 - f PSY 110 Introductory Statistics
 - f PSY 220 Research Methods
 - o Required General Education courses not covered by major preparation courses:
 - f Written Communication
 - f Oral Communication
 - f Critical Thinking
 - f Mathematics
 - f Ethnic Studies (GE Category F)

University Graduation Requirements

Students admitted to the program will be required to comply with all CSULB graduation requirements for a Bachelor's degree. Currently, the CSULB graduation requirements include the following:

- x Earn the number of units for the degree
- x Earn a minimum of 30 units in residence
- x Earn a minimum of 40 upper division units
- x Complete the General Education (GE) pattern
- x Satisfy major requirements
- x Maintain minimum GPA requirements (for the University and major)
- x Satisfy the Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR)

- x Receive formal faculty approval from the major department
