Resolutionon CSU President Searches

<u>Resolved</u> That the Academic Senate of California State University, Long <u>Breachthe CSU</u> Board of Trustees to continue the curreptresidential search policy and actice of having on campus interviews for finalists as a part of the selection process for new Presidents, and be it further,

Resolved That this resolution be distributed to Chancellor Reed, the CSU Board of Trustees via Chair Carter, and to Academic Senate of the California State University James Postma.

Rationale The Board of Trustees is currently considering changes to the current policy on presidential compensation and hiring policies. Historically, presidential candidates have visited the campus for which they were candidates and also held open forums for the campus community.

The loss of campus visits provided for in the proposed policy changes would greatly diminish the role of the campus community in theresidential search process and would eliminate the ability of candidates to meet members of the campus community, including administrators, faculty, staff, students and community members, thereby understanding the issues and challenges they might facerollet.

Campus presidents are presented with a wide variety of difficult challenges, and clearly the California State University should take advantage of any opportunity to allow presordents to build support in their respective communities. Arriving campus without having the support and legitimacy provided by such a process would put the chosen candidate at a significant disadvantage in building a successful transition.
